

**Grief support** is a group that meets on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month at 7 p.m. at the Conference center to learn how to cope with loss through Scripture, prayer, and conversations with others who have experienced loss. No loss is the same, and no healing occurs the same way or in the same time frame. We offer a support system to help us handle our loss in a supportive way.

Grief Support will not meet on 11/27 and will only meet on 12/11. Meetings will resume twice a month in January.



**Caregiver support** is a group that meets on the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of each month at 7 p.m. at the Conference center to address issues related to providing care and support to a loved one facing health challenges. This group will utilize prayer, scripture and conversation to discover ways to handle the stress and emotions in caring for a loved one who is going through such challenging times.

Our Infirmities can be a broken body, broken heart or broken spirit. God knows what we need to lighten our load, although it may not be what we think we need. # First Sunday of Advent



Jeremiah 33:14–16 Psalms 25: 4–5, 8–10, 14 1 Thessalonians 3:12–4:2 Luke 21: 25–28, 34–36

Advent is a time of joy, anticipation, and a time to be ready and stand tall since our salvation is near.

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word *adventus*, which means "coming."

The tradition for the first Sunday of Advent includes lighting the candle of **hope**. This candle of hope symbolizes promises delivered through the prophets from God as well as the hope we have in Christ.

This first Sunday of Advent we read, pray, and reflect on the hope God's plan gives us (foretold by the prophets and fulfilled by the life and death of Christ), and we meditate on the promise of Christ's coming glory-filled return.


# **Reflection Questions:**


Spend some time this week recalling those who have guided you through your life. How have they helped to strengthen you?
