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

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!

"Why?" the child asks when a parent gives an ultimatum about doing something. "Because I said so." the parent answers. Let's face it. This has never been a very satisfactory answer for a child. And we can probably imagine a teenager rolling his or her eyes when they get this response. This answer doesn't give any explanation for doing what is asked, but simply states a chain of command ... a line of authority. In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus' desire that we keep His words functions something like a "Because I said so."

Extraordinary gifts are given to us if we keep His words. His words rest on the authority of Himself, His Father, and the Holy Spirit. This is about as high that a chain of command ... a line of authority ... can get. It all rests on "If you loved Me ..."

To enable us to keep His word, Jesus promises us the gift of a divine indwelling – the Holy Spirit – through whom we are recreated as persons able to live and to love as Jesus Himself did. We are a new creation empowered to continue the mission of Jesus in peace and with fearlessness. To be created anew means that we share in the Life of the Risen Lord – in a very real way, we share in Jesus' very identity. Indeed, this is the gift of Baptism … we are members of the Body of Christ. Only because we share in Jesus' identity as members of His Body can we love as He does, can we truly keep His word, and can we carry on His saving mission.

Jesus' word is a promise of a new relationship with Him and His Father, where God comes and dwells within us through the power of the Holy Spirit. We keep His word, therefore, when we embody in our living the fearlessness and peace of Jesus Christ, and we demonstrate the Presence of the Holy Spirit within us. We keep His word when we respond to the indwelling divine Love with self-giving as modeled by Jesus. The truth and power come from within. It is the truth and power of the Holy Spirit. We are fearless not because of our own power, but because of the Holy Spirit dwelling within us.

The word of Jesus we are to keep is His command to love as He loves us. Jesus' word, however, is not simply spoken – "Because I said so" – but is love-in-action. His love-in-action is the gift of the Holy Spirit of peace, of untroubled hearts, of rejoicing, and of believing. His love-in-action is ultimately the gift of Resurrection and of new Life and relationship with Him. Our love-in-action flows from the gift of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us and teaching us to keep Jesus' word-command to love. Our love-in-action is risen Life-made-visible. Jesus' "Because I said so" is so much more than empty words. It is His own obedience to His Father, His own handing over His Spirit, and His own love-in-action. It must be ours as well.

Living the Paschal Mystery is as demanding as loving with the same self-giving as Jesus, and as easy as responding to God's indwelling as an intimate Friend who is always with us, never forsakes us, and at all times is there for us giving care and strength. These last few weeks before Pentecost when we celebrate the gift of the Spirit are so important for our daily Christian living – they remind us that as disciples we never have to feel like the whole task of living the Gospel falls on our shoulders alone. God is always present, dwelling within us, giving us the strength we need to be faithful to Jesus' commands. Only in this way can our everyday lives be fruitful, can we keep Jesus' word as our own word, and can we show forth Jesus' love-in-action.

May Saint Michael the Archangel defend, guide, protect, and intercede for us!

CONGRATULATIONS

DEVOTION TO Mary remains a hallmark of the Catholic faith. Some people unfamiliar with our religion assume that prayer to Mary forms the backbone of the Mass. Wrong! Prayer to Mary is certainly the backbone of the Rosary, but there isn't a single prayer addressed to Mary in the entire Mass, front to back, on any day of the liturgical year.

When it comes to prayer, we acknowledge Hebrews 7:25, which says Christ lives for ever to make intercession for us. So we direct our prayers to God through Christ.

However, because of Mary's central role in salvation history, she makes several appearances in the texts at every Mass, every day of the liturgical year.

Most important, Mary's name is pronounced right in the heart of Mass in the Eucharistic Prayer. She is called by two titles made mystic by their juxtaposition: virgin and mother. In the second Eucharistic Prayer for children, she is also called "Mother of God and our mother."

Mary also appears in the Creed, as the virgin who conceived the Word made flesh.

At times we celebrate a Mass in her honor, under a title like Mary, Mother of the Church, or to commemorate an event in her life, like the Visitation. A preface often prayed on these days echoes her song of praise, the Magnificat. But most frequently she is remembered as the Virgin Mother.

By connecting these two titles of Mary, the church invites us to reflect on her son. Mary's special role as the Virgin Mother reminds us that the miraculous birth of Jesus introduced the world to an extraordinary child whose miracles would never cease.

At first, the title "Mother of God" sounds wrong. God is the uncreated creator of all. How could God have a mother? That puzzling question draws us into a deeper meditation on the identity of Jesus. Because Jesus is both fully God and fully human, Mary must be called Mother of God.

In the liturgy Mary's role always bows to her son. She gives birth to him not only in time but in the liturgy and in our hearts. During the month of May, many will address devotions to Mary, and rightly so. But she will direct them to Christ.


The Cathedral Clothing Store in Camden

Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 | Rev 21:10-14, 22-23 | Jn 14:23-29

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In the reading from John's Gospel today, Jesus eases into the message he has for his disciples - a message he knows they don't want to hear: He has to leave them. But Jesus tells his disciples that if they love him and keep his commandments, he and the Father will "make their dwelling" within them. He then assures them they will not be alone: The Advocate will come to not only remind them of all he taught them, but also teach them everything they need to know in the future. Finally, he offers them peace, the peace that comes only through the Spirit and draws them closer to God. Though Jesus knows they are broken-hearted that he is leaving, he tells them to rejoice if they love him, for he is returning to his Father. Jesus' words to the first disciples ring true for every disciple throughout the ages. He does not leave anyone who loves him alone. He sends his Spirit to dwell in us, to teach and remind us of his love and how to love one another. The Spirit guides us, encourages us, and sustains us always. We are never alone.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The first Christians, guided by the Holy Spirit, shared this message with the Gentile communities to whom they were ministering: "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities." This is a profound moment in the Church as it shows first, the power of the Holy Spirit working in and with the Apostles; and second, the importance of faith (not ritual circumcision, or other human laws) for salvation. The Gospel is intended for all, without exception, and the Holy Spirit is our help and our Advocate in our own lives of faith, and in our sharing of that faith with others. Let us seek the counsel of the Holy Spirit in all we do, that we might be a blessing, not a burden, for everyone seeking the glory of God's light.



STUDY The Acts of the Apostles is an amazing account of how Jesus' followers grew from a small group of frightened people into the courageous and zealous missionaries who founded his Church. Read the *catechism* from 687-747 to learn more about the Holy Spirit and pray for the grace to let him work in and through you for the salvation of all who seek him.
