SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION ...

<u>The Sacrament of Baptism</u>: Held during the 4p Mass on Saturday; during the 8a or 10a Mass on Sunday. Also held Saturday morning or after Mass on Sunday at the convenience of the family.

<u>Pre-Baptism Class</u>: Required for parents / guardians who have not attended a class in the previous two (2) years. The Parish of Saint Michael the Archangel generally offers its class throughout the year on the third (3rd) Monday of the month at 7p in the Rectory Conference Room. Please call the Parish Office <u>at least two</u> (2) weeks in advance to register for a class.

<u>Funerals</u>: To be arranged through the Funeral Home of your choice. Your Funeral Director will contact the church.

<u>Sacrament of the Sick:</u> Anytime, however, due to the HIPAA Privacy Act, the individual needing the Sacrament or a family member needs to call the Parish.

Communion to the Sick / Homebound: Please call the Parish Office.

Marriage: Arrangements should be made one (1) year in advance, prior to making any reception plans.

Certificates of Eligibility: For those asked to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Canon law (Church law) requires that you need to be at least sixteen (16) years of age *OR* you have received all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation). You are living a chaste life (not living with someone) and, if married, you were married according to the laws and teachings of the Catholic Church. Finally, you are a practicing Catholic, registered in the Parish and actively participate in the Sacramental life of the Church (you attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days). Certificates of Eligibility are given by the church where you are registered and active, *not where you made your Sacraments*. If you are an adult (25+) still living at home, it is a great idea to register in your parish under your own name, not simply to be registered under your parents.

My Dear Friends,

Welcome Home! Christmas is upon us once again!

The trees get decorated, gifts are purchased and exchanged, various foods are prepared, businesses have their Christmas (or Holiday) parties, cards are sent, students return <u>home</u> from college, families get together from far and wide to share good times, etc., etc., etc..

Part of the routine for many is attendance at Mass. By the way, did you ever take the time to examine the last part of the word, Christmas? The word itself comes from the Old English for *Christ's Mass*.

The <u>Season of Christmas</u> begins on Christmas Day, December 25th, and extends to January 8th this year, the **Epiphany**, also known as "Three Kings Day," even though the traditional date for the Epiphany is January 6th. In any case, the celebration of Christmas and the Christmas Season is well beyond celebrating one day, going well beyond December 25th ... just remember the "12 Days of Christmas."

A possible Christian interpretation of the song continues below:

1 – 12/25 – "A Partridge in a Pear Tree" – True Love refers to God ... Jesus Christ becoming man ... God becoming man.
2 – 12/26 – "2 Turtle Doves" – refers to the Old and New Testaments

3 – 12/27 – **"3 French Hens"** – refers to Faith, Hope and Charity, the Theological Virtues

4 – 12/28 – "4 Calling Birds" – refers to the Four Gospels and / or the Four Evangelists, Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John 5 – 12/29 – "5 Golden Rings" – refers to the first Five Books of the Old Testament, the "Pentateuch," which gives the history of man's fall from grace.

6 – 12/30 – "**6 Geese A-laying**" – refers to the six days of creation

7 – 12/31 – "7 Swans A-swimming" – refers to the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and / or the seven Sacraments

8 – 01/01 – "8 Maids A-milking" – refers to the eight beatitudes

9 – 01/02 – **"9 Ladies Dancing"** – refers to the nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit

10 – 01/03 – "10 Lords A-leaping" – refers to the Ten Commandments

11 – 01/04 – "11 Pipers Piping" – refers to the eleven faithful Apostles

12 – 01/05 – **"12 Drummers Drumming"** – refers to the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostles' Creed

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

The day we have been awaiting has arrived: Christ is born! All of our Christmas preparations – wrapping gifts and preparing holiday meals to be shared among family and friends – are meant to glorify and reflect God's own work for and in us. That is, God's greatest gift of himself, clothed in mortal flesh, who would one day offer himself as the bread of life: "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us." Jesus came to the world in the form of the most helpless of us all, a newborn infant, so that through him we would be reconciled to the Father, for "to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God." We celebrate the Incarnation of the Lord, for Christ is our salvation! It is through Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit that we are adopted into God's family and receive the fullness of his grace. The fullness of God's truth is revealed in Jesus Christ. "The Lord has made his salvation known"; "he has spoken to us through the Son." Let us give thanks and rejoice this day!

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The Good News of Jesus Christ is not meant to be kept to ourselves. Today's Gospel reading reminds us that John the Baptist testified to the light of Christ before Christ had yet publicly appeared. Sharing the Good News is not optional! Even the earth proclaims the Good News in Isaiah, "announcing salvation, and saying to Zion, 'Your God is King!'" Indeed, Christ the King – God in human flesh – has arrived. Just as John was sent before the Lord to proclaim his coming, so are we charged: Sent out to the world to go and announce the Gospel of the Lord, "so that all might believe."

WITNESS How might you go out and proclaim the coming of the Lord? Don't forget: sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ isn't limited just to speaking to others. It includes *living* as Christ did – feeding the hungry, caring for the sick and the poor, defending the helpless – because we are Christ's body in the world.


