

Dear Parishioners,

In the first part of 2019, I was quite taken aback after allowing several viewings to occur in both Saint Catherine of Siena Church in Clayton and Nativity Church in Franklinville. During one of these viewings, the family brought coolers of food, soda, and other beverages into the main body of the church. During another, all kinds of beverages were brought in and individuals were allowed to play cards in the Chapel / cry area while the rest of the family was in the main part of the church. I wouldn't have believed it if I hadn't witnessed it myself. Perhaps those sorts of behaviors are permitted in a Funeral Home, <u>but in a church</u>? Jesus Christ is present in the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle in the Sanctuary of the church and granted, people might not be able to see that with the casket open in the front of the altar, but our Lord is present, nonetheless. After several of those viewings, I personally also had to spend 1-2 hours cleaning up all of the stuff that was left behind. In my opinion, these behaviors were unacceptable for inside a church building.

As a result, in July 2019, I stopped allowing viewings in church. Since then, I have received a lot of push-back from families who have wanted to have viewings for their loved ones in church. There has been a lot of anger and a lot of comments have been made asking why I'm punishing everyone for the simple reason that a few did not know how to behave in church.

I have prayed long and hard about this issue. And so, <u>effective March 1, 2020</u>, I will once again allow viewings / visitations prior to a Funeral Mass in the churches of the Parish of Saint Michael the Archangel. With that being said, I am also asking the assistance of the families who wish to use either church for a Viewing prior to a Funeral Mass for the following:

- For families wishing to have a Viewing / Visitation in church and while having the Viewing / Visitation in church, please be mindful of the need for reverence and respect inside the church building and for the Church and the Catholic faith. The Blessed Sacrament, our Lord Jesus Christ, is reserved in the Tabernacle as evidenced by the red Presence Candle.
- Cell phone use in church should be kept to a minimum. All cell phones should be on silent or vibrate in the main body of the church. Any business on a cell phone should be conducted in the Gathering Space or outside.
- The only beverage permitted in the main body of the church is water <u>for the family</u>. No coffee, soda, or other beverages are permitted. Please do not bring coffee cups or other beverages into the main body of the church.
- No food is permitted in the main body of the church.
- The Chapel / cry area will be locked and unavailable for the duration of the viewing.
- If music is to be played during the viewing, please select instrumental pieces that are appropriate for inside church. Secular songs are not permitted in Church celebrations and should be reserved to the reception that follows the Funeral / Committal.
- With regard to cremains, a visitation in church or a Funeral Mass cannot be scheduled at the Parish of Saint Michael the Archangel without specification that the arrangements for a proper Christian burial have been made. This includes Viewings and Funeral Masses where the deceased is to be cremated after the Mass has concluded.

I think you will agree that having a Viewing / Visitation (also known as a "Vigil" or a "Vigil Service") in a Funeral Home *is not the same as having one in church*. I think in today's society, many individuals have lost sight of that. It also seems that quite often, viewings have become a social outlet where people who have not seen one another in years have the opportunity to catch up. However, family and friends of the deceased, when paying their respects in a church, need to be reminded and need to remember *they are in church*. Perhaps, if the family anticipates a lot of "catching up" between friends and relatives of the deceased, it would be better to suggest the Viewing / Visitation occur in the Funeral Home. As a Vigil, it should be celebrated in the evening, the evening before the Funeral Mass. The Vigil is the proper time to share stories about the deceased, and therefore, it is also the appropriate time to offer a eulogy or words of remembrance. The Vigil is likewise the proper place for families to display pictures or those things that symbolize the life of the deceased.

I ask you to take few moments to read them. My deepest apologies for the families affected by this policy. Thank you for your understanding.

- The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.
- On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those who are between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
- On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of Abstinence
- The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially" or as a whole is a serious obligation.
- The Fridays of the year outside of Lent are designated as days of Penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as Penance.
- The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty) extends from the First Sunday of Lent (March 1, 2020) to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity (June 7, 2020).
