Trusting in God's mercy, we are called to see God at work, to be thankful, and to respond with our entire life. In our polarized society, it is important to look for God everywhere and to expect that many of those different from us are doing the Lord's work. We are called to respect and to reverence all peoples ... even when we disagree.

Dear Parishioners,



As I've gotten older, I've learned that by simply observing what is in and around a person's home, I can usually discover what they truly value. If every corner is filled with things, the person values inanimate objects ... things. If the walls and tabletops are full of pictures of family and friends, the person values relationships. If there are healthy green plants about (maybe even fresh flowers), the person values growth and life. If the space is uncluttered, the person values simplicity and silence. The Gospel for this weekend, the 17th Sunday / Week in Ordinary Time, speaks to the value of the kingdom of heaven. How might that be captured in a person's home? Well, maybe by a crucifix on the wall or a piece of religious art or a statue. But I think more importantly, we might know the kingdom of heaven is present when God is present ... manifested in the "treasures" of God ... hospitality and kindness ... joy and love ... wisdom and understanding. These expressions of the divine presence are no less real than the furniture, decorations, and things about the house.

All three comparisons in the Gospel point to the incomparable value of the kingdom of heaven. But God's kingdom is not fully revealed by images such as earthly treasure, priceless gems, an abundance of sumptuous seafood, or the things we have about the house. The kingdom of heaven is fully revealed in people who possess" a heart so wise and understanding" (as described by the First Reading) ... that they know what is right and judge justly. Discipleship means searching for this treasure of incomparable value and giving all we have to become part of it. As disciples, we should continually seek those things that we want more than anything else.

The treasure we go out to seek isn't some <u>thing</u> in some <u>place</u> ... it is nothing less than the very presence of God that is breaking in upon us now but is only fully realized in the future. Now here is where the Gospel should surprise us ... the kingdom of heaven isn't some object or realm that we can identify physically ... instead it is the gift of divine presence God gives us (like where Solomon asks for wisdom in the First Reading). God's presence to us is a free, unexpected, and invaluable gift.

Isn't it a beautiful thing that God even asks us what we want ("Ask something of Me and I will give it to you?" ... First Reading). I think this demonstrates how much God cares for us. It confirms that God chooses to be involved in our affairs. It reveals God's abiding presence to us. This is the kingdom of heaven ... God's presence. We already have the wisdom we need to recognize the kingdom (the same wisdom Solomon asked for in the First Reading). It is a gift of the Holy Spirit first given to us in Baptism. God gives us the gift to understand. All we need to do is use it to seek God's loving presence within us and around us.

This "treasure" does have a cost. We must actively search for it, recognize it when we find it, and sort out all of the distractions that keep us from recognizing it. In the Gospel, the seekers go to all the obvious places to find the treasure. For us, the discovery of the kingdom is most often in our everyday circumstances. This may be something as simple as the smile of a person's grateful thanks or the sense of rightness that comes from being faithful to our daily prayer. It might be something harder and challenging... like admitting we've hurt someone. It might be demanding ... like committing time to help someone in need. The issue is to recognize that God chooses to be present to us and wants us to see that presence with all our hearts ... to be able do this all the time ... not just when we feel like it.

May Saint Michael the Archangel defend, guide, protect, and intercede for us always! May you and your families be well and safe! Have a great week!
