

The Church does not set up the voting booths, but when we go into the voting booths, we don't cease to be members of the Church! If we don't shape public policy according to moral truths, why do we believe that moral truth at all?"



Dear Parishioners,

We are sometimes more like the scribes and the Pharisees of Jesus' time than we sometimes care or like to admit ... that is, we fulfill the law perfectly, but have little regard for what the law is calling us to actually do. One easy example ... many cities have erected speed and red light cameras at critical intersections that have caused serious accidents in the past. The law gives us a speed limit and asks us to stop (or slow down) when the light is red or yellow. The reason for this law is to save injury and lives. Yet, so many of us disregard the law. We step on the gas when we see a traffic light turning yellow and we regularly exceed the posted speed limits. However, if we know the camera is at a particular intersection, we slow down and stop ... and then when we hit an intersection without the camera, we stomp on the gas. Yes, we keep the law. But our heart isn't in it ... our wallet is.

In this weekend's Gospel selection is a continuation of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount and is a blueprint for faithful Christian living. In it, Jesus is speaking about laws and human behavior. He doesn't make His hearers' lives easier by relaxing the law. He does, however, give a better reason for keeping the law rather than the consequences of breaking them ... and that is deepening the relationship with those around us. He has not come to abolish the law. He has come to show us what its fulfillment looks like.

What does it mean for Jesus to fulfill the law? Jesus sees in the law the means to fulfillment of time ("until all things have taken place") ... when the law will be replaced by righteous relationships within the kingdom of heaven. The fundamental law is gift of self to others. When self-giving is lacking in any act of keeping the law, the law in fact is not kept. We are to keep the law as the way to enter a manner of caring for and relating to others that leads to fullness of Life. Our model for doing so is Jesus.

Each example given in this weekend's Gospel points to typical human behaviors that every one of us experience at one time or another in our lives: anger with those close to us ... the need for reconciliation ... repayment of just debts ... faithfulness in relationships ... temptation ... doing what we mean to do. As human beings, we can expect to have difficulties with one another. Jesus is not asking us to be perfect. He is asking us to pay attention to how we deal with one another and strive for a "righteousness" (that is, right relationships) that surpasses what we need to do minimally to get along with each other.

Practically, this means we don't say a mechanical "I'm sorry" when we've hurt another. If we say it, we mean it. We need to say it from the heart and strive to do whatever we can to restore the rupture in the relationship. It means that we need to look at the root of our anger with others and perhaps discover what needs to change in us. It means that when we are unfaithful in relationships, we question whether we are demanding too much of others or whether our own selfishness is getting in the way of growing in love for others. It means that we follow through on our commitments.

The "righteousness" that Jesus asks of us is not concerned with minimums – even of keeping the law – but is concerned with caring for others as He did. It means loving as He did. Jesus lives the supreme act of love: giving self totally. To follow Jesus faithfully, we must also develop a daily habit of giving self to others – for their good and for our own. For a life habit of self-giving love is the only we "enter the kingdom of heaven."

May Saint Michael the Archangel defend, guide, protect, and intercede for us always!
